St Joseph Affordable Homes

St Joseph's Affordable Homes (SJAH) is the new building and construction social enterprise launched by the Archdiocese of Hobart in July 2020.

St Joseph Affordable Homes uses the extensive affordable and social housing construction programs of Centacare Evolve Housing and CatholicCare Tasmania to deliver on its purpose to provide employment and mentoring support services for young Tasmanians and their families. The organisation is committed to providing much needed trade apprenticeships in a range of construction areas, gained through an in-house apprenticeship scheme.

St Joseph Affordable Homes has over 100 new homes in the pipeline for construction in the next 12 months, with potential to scale up.



Overview

In the midst of the 2020 Covid pandemic, the Catholic Church established St Joseph Affordable Homes. After 6 months of operation our work has been identified as delivering outcomes that support the economic recovery of the state, in particular through the delivery of employment outcomes, increasing building and construction activity, and addressing the housing and homelessness crisis through increasing the number of community housing homes.

In 2020 we commenced construction on 63 new homes for community housing in Southern Tasmania, with over 100 in the pipeline. In December, 2020 the first completed project of nine new homes in New Norfolk was officially opened by the Premier and Minister for Housing.

A highlight for our start-up phase has been to witness the positive impact of our in-house apprenticeship program. In 2020 we were able to announce our first 6 young apprentices, including 16 year old carpentry apprentice Cianna who wants to become an advocate for young women who aspire to make positive life choices. Our apprenticeship program enhances the outcomes of Centacare Evolve Housing's successful Build Up Tassie youth training and work ready program.

The following social impact report demonstrates the contribution that St Joseph Affordable Homes has had in its first 6 months and in setting the foundations for the future. I am incredibly proud to work alongside a passionate team at St Joseph Affordable Homes who are all driven to make a difference. We are part of a long and continuing tradition of Catholic service to people in need.




Build Up Tassie



Build Up Tassie creates pathways to employment, including apprenticeships, through linkages to industry and with significant training partners such as Southern Central Trade Training Centre, TasBGAS and Tasmanian Building and Construction Training Board. Build Up Tassie leverages Centacare Evolve Housing and CatholicCare Tasmania’s significant construction programs and in 2020 was in its third year of operation.
