Centacare Evolve Housing is a Tier 1 Community Housing Provider, operating statewide and delivering services in tenancy, maintenance and community wellbeing. The company also manages CatholicCare Tasmania's housing services including affordable housing and rapid rehousing.

In addition to providing tenancy and community support, Centacare Evolve Housing has a significant new build and construction program, with over 600 new social and affordable homes in the pipeline for construction.



EXECUTIVE MESSAGE

This year's Annual Report demonstrates our unwavering commitment to advance the mission of the Church, through building houses, creating homes and growing communities. The stories and statistics show the significant contribution we have made alleviating housing stress and homelessness and improving the wellbeing of individuals, families and communities across Tasmania. I am incredibly proud to lead a team supporting over 4400 Tasmanians through tenancy management and wellbeing services. In a year like no other we have increased our build program, completing close to 200 homes with over 600 in the pipeline till June 2023. is the first time we demonstrate the benefit of our programs through social impact valuations, which allows us to share the positive outcomes of our work and make informed decisions about investment.

Our continued success is made possible through the combined efforts of many individuals including the fantastic team at Centacare Evolve Housing and the broader Catholic Church, as well as our critical partners across government and industry. I am extremely grateful to everyone involved and look forward to the year ahead working together to make a difference.

CHAIR'S REPORT

Centacare Evolve Housing, which was formed by the Archdiocese of Hobart in 2014 in conjunction with Evolve Housing, has reached a significant stage of maturity in all respects including tenant and community engagement, building programs and governance structure, to become a substantial Tier 1 accredited Community Housing Provider. As retiring chair and this being my last report, it seems appropriate to reflect on our beginnings and aims.

The genesis of Centacare Evolve Housing was to support and drive one of the integral parts of the mission of the Archdiocese of Hobart which is to ensure that secure housing and support services are provided and that the wellbeing of the communities we serve is assisted and enhanced.

Prior to the formation of Centacare Evolve Housing, CatholicCare Tasmania was and continues to be involved in the provision of affordable housing and working together, Centacare Evolve Housing and CatholicCare Tasmania are a substantial provider of social and affordable housing and support services throughout Tasmania. St Joseph Affordable Homes was recently formed by the Archdiocese to support our building programs and importantly to provide apprenticeship and skill pathways, where otherwise those opportunities would not exist, and this initiative is working with a significant number of young and mature age apprentices now permanently employed and provided with ongoing support and mentoring to ensure that they become fully accredited.

Centacare Evolve Housing has, in collaboration with CatholicCare Tasmania and with the provision of Government grant funds, and utilising land provided by the Archdiocese, Councils and others, embarked on an ambitious and achievable program of building homes to reduce a growing housing wait list and lack of affordable rentals. Our combined work in this space addresses a crisis which shows little signs of abating, in terms of housing and rental affordability.

Our mission is more than just words, it is to, "Build Houses" which we do, and over the next two years Centacare Evolve Housing will deliver over 600 new homes, and we say "Creating Homes", because we want the houses we provide to become and be the security of home and we say "Growing Communities" because we strive to engage with and support the communities we serve.

There is a team of people at Centacare Evolve Housing in administration, tenancy support, community wellbeing, maintenance and building that are dedicated to and work towards achieving our objectives and fulfilling our mission and they have our thanks. Chief Executive Officer Ben Wilson who has been the initiator and driver of many of our programs and who lives our mission has my thanks.

I thank the Archdiocese for both the privilege and opportunity to have been able to participate in and play some small part in assisting the communities we serve.

CASE STUDY

Mrs Bennet and her family of five children have always lived in private rentals and moved around often due to not having long-term leases. Their last move was sudden. After living in a private rental for three years, the property owners decided to sell unexpectedly. This left Mrs Bennet and her children in a tough situation with no quick affordable rental options available.

The family had to couch-surf between friends' places and with family. It was very difficult on the Bennet family and at one stage they were all sleeping in a 2-bedroom property. After being on the Tasmanian Housing Register for six months they were offered a property by Centacare Evolve Housing.

Mrs Bennet said that she started to work night shifts but did not realise the negative impact it would have on her life. Over time the house and her family became less of a priority and concerns started to creep into her life, including family violence. The children stopped going to school.

During this time a Centacare Evolve Housing tenancy officer was able to engage with Mrs Bennet and refer her onto our internal Client Support Coordinator. The support coordinator works with tenants to address significant issues and to improve the wellbeing of tenants and their families. After 18 months of being a tenant with our organisation, Mrs Bennet no longer requires one-on-one assistance. She has a new kitchen being installed soon and her property has never looked this great. Mrs Bennet said she felt that the constant support had helped her make the change. She has also learned new skills along the way, including painting and plastering and is now very happy in her personal life.

COMMUNITY WELLBEING

Key initiatives to support thriving tenancies

- Assisting unit complexes to create shared connection spaces, including: common rooms, BBQ areas, communal gardens, bench seating, and activating neighbourhood connection groups in Westbury, Wynyard, Burnie, Richmond, New Norfolk and Claremont.
- Empowering tenants' expression and voice through Tenant Engagement Groups, including 116 participants across 15 sessions, in Brighton and Glenorchy.
- Promoting inclusivity by welcoming tenants with gift packs with their new home, plus gifting over 900 'hearts of kindness' across the state as part of 1,000 Hearts of Kindness Project.

One-on-one support provided to 32 tenants

- Ensuring at risk tenancies are stabilised.

Tenant satisfaction

- 87% tenant satisfaction met or exceeded, for services provided by Centacare Evolve Housing.
- 83% tenant satisfaction met or exceeded, for the condition of their property.

Equipping our tenant community, staff and key stakeholders to understand us, by providing communications and key messages, newsletters, tenant handbooks, online resources via the website, fact and information sheets and merchandise.

We engaged with nine campaigns to focus on areas to advocate for change, including Homelessness Week, Volunteer Week and NAIDOC Week.

The Neighbourhood Leadership Program saw participants build capacity and develop communication skills needed to develop successful community projects and events.

Strategic partnerships with four peak bodies ensured Centacare Evolve Housing continued to work within best practice frameworks, promoting brand recognition and opportunities for partnership and collaboration. Shelter Tas (state), Community Housing Industry Association (national), PowerHousing (national) and Housing Industry Association (state and national).

Informed six research projects and government submissions to advocate for social and affordable housing and individual and community wellbeing.

Centacare Evolve Housing supported 66 tenants in 2020/21 who were involved in the Rapid Rehousing program. These tenants represented 1.5% of all tenants who were housed with Centacare Evolve Housing.

The total social benefit of the program is the outcomes achieved by 'improving a feeling of safety'. According to the Australian Social Value Bank, for every dollar spent on the program there is \$3.97 social benefit over a 12 month period.

Centacare Evolve Housing supported 32 tenants in 2020/21 who were at high risk of losing their tenancies with out additional support. These tenants represented .72% of all tenants who were in social housing with Centacare Evolve Housing.

The total social benefit of the program is the outcomes achieved preventing people from being made homeless (homelessness to social housing). According to the Australian Social Value Bank, for every dollar spent to house someone there is a \$4.28 benefit over a 12 month period.

BUILD UP TASSIE

Build Up Tassie is Centacare Evolve Housing’s voluntary work-readiness program proudly supported by St Joseph Affordable Homes. This unique initiative is the seeding ground for participants to gain employment in building and construction, including apprenticeships with St Joseph Affordable Homes.

Build Up Tassie had 22 participants in 2020/21. The total social benefit of the program is the outcomes measured by:

- a) gaining full time employment
- b) casual employment or part time hours
- c) job readiness

According to the Australian Social Value Bank, for every dollar invested into the program, a \$4.49 social benefit is achieved.

Following the work-readiness program, crew members are invited to apply to become a St Joseph Affordable Homes apprentice.

MEET LUKAS

Lukas joined the Build Up Tassie program just after the COVID-19 lock down in July 2020. Prior to this he worked at McDonald's. At the time Lukas felt he had hit a bit of a roadblock and had no idea how to access other opportunities, particularly in the Building and Construction Industry.

According to Lukas the Build Up Tassie program provided him with opportunities to try different trade environments. A key moment in the program was when Lukas realised he had a chance at obtaining a qualification, which could set him up for the future. He decided he was ready.

"I have become more confident in how to speak up and towards any issue I have, which helps me to go about my life without much worry".

After Lukas finished Build Up Tassie he gained an apprenticeship as a carpenter with St Joseph Affordable Homes and is now enjoying his days on site, upskilling and building social and affordable homes.

THE FUTURE

Centacare Evolve Housing has successfully tendered for the State Government's Community Housing Growth Program. Two key components from this tender will provide for the construction of new social and affordable homes, and the management transfer of just over 400 Housing Tasmania properties to the organisation.

While additional management transfers and new construction commitments are key components of the organisation's ongoing growth, they also provide an opportunity to expand the reach and profile of its community wellbeing activities. Tenant engagement opportunities and activities are being planned in areas with a new or additional presence – meaning the future is bright for the communities we continue to serve.

With added housing stock comes increased maintenance and upgrade commitments. An updated Asset Management Plan will be actioned to address revised contractual maintenance requirements across all managed properties.
