



A Message from the General Manager

2021 was another year of uncertainty. It is easy to look back on the year and only see the challenges and forget all the achievements. We have heard a lot of news about the housing affordability crisis in Tasmania - high rents, long wait lists and a shortage of available properties. This is a very real issue which is causing great difficulty for many families, but it is important that we acknowledge the good things that have been happening this year. In 2021, Centacare Evolve Housing tenanted 185 newly built dwellings throughout the state and we have 540 more to be built over the coming 18 months.

Centacare Evolve Housing took over the management of 400+ Housing Tasmania properties in the south of the state and we warmly welcome those households to our tenant community. Our commitment to maintenance saw 6560 maintenance requests actioned and completed. Importantly our Community Wellbeing Team grew and continued to expand its reach across the state.

It is always the outcomes that mean the most:

- 469 new leases were signed this year. This means we now have over 5000 Tasmanians living in over 2500 properties we manage - "The home saved me, after sleeping in my car for three years I couldn't believe it" (tenant quote)
- 17 young people now have full time apprenticeships in the construction industry thanks to our Build Up Tassie program
- 6 participants completed our Neighbourhood Leadership Program and two participant led community projects will be supported by Centacare Evolve Housing in 2022
- Over 1,700 people walked through the gates of the Brighton Christmas Block Party which provided family fun, food and entertainment.

Addressing the housing shortage will take time and sadly many people start 2022 without a suitable place to call home. We remain committed to doing what we can to help shift the balance and look forward to welcoming more new tenants in 2022.



Thank you to everyone who has helped make 2021 a year of achievement, despite the challenges and look forward to growing community together in 2022.
